Without focus on all three points there will only be partial successes. Finally, while I am not an extensive traveler, light rail must be a component of our future. When in DC, 80% of my travel is by the Metro; the same for when I am in Boston, Chicago or Atlanta. I find it unfortunate that having lived in Norfolk now for 32 years we have only taken small steps toward thinking as a region instead of multiple city-principalities. I want to see us with the political clout of NOVA and the regional leadership of Richmond. We are the biggest harbor and have the greatest military infrastructure on the east coast, yet we are constantly begging to get transportation infrastructure (rail & interstate) expanded for our needs as a populace and as a commercial hub. Rather than the new shopping outlets at Lake Wright I would have preferred to see property purchased by the city/airport parallel to Miller Road stretching from Lake Wright past Bayside Rd. that would have potentially allowed for the creation of a 2nd major runway for the airport. Would it have provided the length necessary for 747s, no, but it would provide options for increasing capacity and would have given travelers direct access to the hotels along Northampton Blvd to airline travels via an easily accessible shuttle bus or tram-line. Light rail could easily be routed along the current rail line that runs parallel to Cape Henry Ave directly to the airport, further increasing traveler access to downtown hotels & businesses.

There are many communities in the commonwealth of Virginia, smaller & more rural than Norfolk, whose city shelters who are saving upwards of 75 or 80% of the animals that come through their doors (for example: Fairfax County [90% save rate in 2013], Augusta County [94% save rate in 2014], and Charlottesville [96% save rate in 2013]). There is no reason whatsoever that the city of Norfolk, with its well-educated population and access to tools & funding & enthusiastic network of animal-loving volunteers, cannot do better with its city sheltering practices. A compassionate director with a focus on No-Kill sheltering policies needs to be hired & retained. A TNR program for feral cats MUST be implemented. The animals in our city shelter don't have much hope of making it out alive, and the city can and MUST do better.

It is punitively high as compared to our neighboring cities and has created unnecessary burden on recreational boaters, commercial fishermen and charter boats, marinas and boat storage facilities, and those in the marine trades. The boat tax has caused a mass exodus of boaters and marine industry professionals to neighboring cities that have a significantly lower boat tax. Fishing and boating on the Chesapeake Bay and its tributaries is a huge part of our cultural identity and something that makes Norfolk great, and the way we do it here is special and unique to the rest of the region and even to the rest of the world!

I would like to see our local and state representatives become more passionate, more visible, and as beacons of honor and integrity. I have never been so disappointed in our leadership as when the Elizabeth River Tunnels began tolling. This was unjust, unwise and just plain bad for business. The Midtown and Downtown Tunnels are vital to our national infrastructure and the burden of improvements and maintenance should not fall so heavily on the individual citizen. If that argument could not have been successfully made (or perhaps another argument against the tolls made more successfully) on behalf of the constituency, then those who failed to defend the citizens they represent have failed to be effective at their jobs. We need to re-evaluate our leadership at every level to ensure we are acting in the best interest of current and future constituents, because the ERC tolls are just one example of the abject failure or neglect of our representatives in our local government and those representing Norfolk citizens at the state level.

Our schools have a terrible reputation in the region. NPS' justifiably poor reputation has resulted in the loss of well-qualified teaching professionals to higher paying jobs in neighboring cities (Virginia Beach and Chesapeake, in particular). It affects property values and it affects our identity as citizens of Norfolk. An elected School Board was a good start. Now we need to find a Superintendent for NPS that will commit to this community for a consistent number of years. There has been WAY too much overturn in that position. Is this an issue of not being able to attract a qualified candidate? Is this an issue of integrity in education? Is this part of a larger national trend that Norfolk can set an example by breaking the cycle? We need to be investing more time, effort, and budget to our schools. We need to prioritize the safety and education of our children more greatly. The children of Norfolk deserve to feel pride in their education, pride in their origins and heritage, that they are cared for, that their future has been planned. This will help alleviate the loss of students to larger metropolitan areas once they have graduated high school or college - if there is a reciprocal sense of pride between the student and the community, the student will feel more inclined to reinvest their time and effort into their city, and to plan a future in Norfolk/Hampton Roads rather than elsewhere.
