Services and Programs

Huntersville Neighborhood Service Center Programs & Amenities

Huntersville Pool [664-7431]

Offers swimming classes for children and adults, open and family swim and the opportunity to participate in the Huntersville Swim Team.



Norfolk Interfaith Partnership Mentorship Program, Inc

[623-7000] Provides mentoring services designed and targeted at strengthening adult individuals and families. The Mentorship Program is designed to preserve, maintain, and stabilize families. Additional services include: Share Program, Emergency Non-Food Items, Companion Training, and more.

Urban League of Hampton Roads, Inc. [226-7589]

Program is designed to improve job retention by providing low and moderate-income participants with effective job seeking and life management skills. Services includes: Work Preparedness Training, career assessment, employment counseling, assistance with resume writing, job referral, and case management.

GENERAL SERVICES

Women, Infant, Children (WIC) [683-9280 ext: 105] This is a supplemental food program. It serves pregnant women, breast-feeding women, and women who have children 1-5 years of age and who are at a nutrition risk.

Norfolk Department of Human Services [664-7410] This agency provides social and financial services to indigent clients and families, including Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF), Medicaid, State Local Hospitalization (SLH), insurance, food stamps and energy assistance (heating and cooling).

Juvenile Court [664-7475] This agency provides supervision for youth who are under the jurisdiction of the Norfolk Juvenile Court.

Adult Basic Education (ABE) [664-7441] The Adult Basic Education program is designed to meet the needs of adults 18 years or older who desire to learn basic skills in reading, grammar, writing and math. This program helps students prepare for entering a high school diploma program or a GED review class.

Department of Recreation, Parks and Open Spaces [664-7434] This department provides recreational and educational activities and programs to youth, adults and seniors in the community.
