Project Bulletin Emergency Sewer Repair Argonne Avenue

Dear Valued Customer,

During last week's nor'easter, the sanitary sewer pipe that runs under Argonne Avenue near Pershing Avenue collapsed. An emergency pump was installed to bypass the collapsed section of pipe. We have hired a contractor to replace the broken pipe as soon as possible. Tomorrow, KevCor Contracting will begin replacing approximately 330 feet of sewer pipe from manhole to manhole. The work zone is shown in the hatched area on the map to the right and will take approximately 4 weeks to complete.

While construction is underway, Argonne Avenue will be closed to through traffic between Lafayette Boulevard and Pershing Avenue. Access to driveways will be maintained throughout this repair project.

The City and our contractor will do our best to minimize the unavoidable disruptions associated with the construction.
