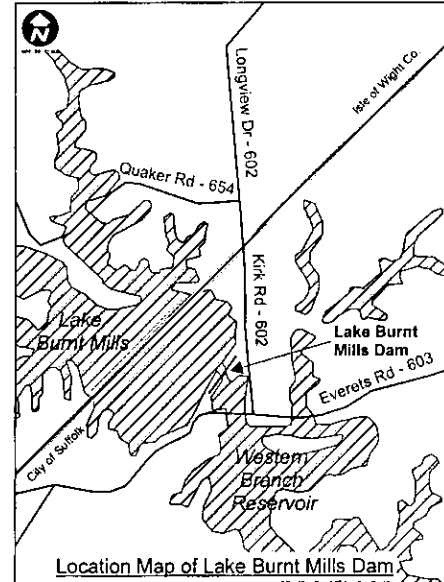

PROJECT BULLETIN

Project: Lake Burnt Mills Dam – Safety Modifications

The City of Norfolk's Department of Utilities is upgrading the Lake Burnt Mills Dam. The dam is located in Suffolk near the intersection of Everets Road (Route 603) and Kirk Road (Route 602). The contractor has been working since fall 2006. The expected substantial completion date is summer 2009.

Earlier, the lake was lowered as much as 10 feet below the spillway elevation ("normal pool") in order to facilitate the contractor's construction operations. More recently, the lake has been maintained at approximately 3 feet below the normal pool elevation while the contractor completed a key step in the construction of the new intake tower. The lake level is now being lowered as much as 14 feet below the normal pool elevation in order to allow the contractor to install a new pipe under the dam.




The contractor expects to complete the installation of the new pipe in January 2009. Once the new pipe is installed, the lake level will be allowed to return to its normal pool elevation while the contractor completes the final phase of the project. We cannot determine exactly when the lake level will return to normal since the lake's source of water is the runoff from rainfall.
