





III. **Description:**

This agenda item is an ordinance to accept \$223,000⁰⁰ state opioid response (SOR) grant award from the Virginia Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services for the Norfolk Community Services Board ("NCSB") to provide opioid treatment and peer recovery services to individuals with substance abuse disorder

IV. **Analysis**

The Virginia SOR grant will fund opioid medication assisted treatment and it will fund peer staffing.

\$69,000 is for opioid treatment and \$154,000 is for peer recovery services. Total grant is \$223,000. No match required. This a nine-month award (January 2019 to September 2019).

ORDINANCE No.

AN ORDINANCE ACCEPTING, APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE EXPENDITURE OF \$223,000 STATE OPIOID RESPONSE (SOR) GRANT AWARD FROM THE VIRGINIA DEPARTMENT OF BEHAVIORAL HEALTH AND DEVELOPMENTAL SERVICES FOR THE NORFOLK COMMUNITY SERVICES BOARD TO PROVIDE OPIOID TREATMENT AND PEER RECOVERY SERVICES TO INDIVIDUALS WITH SUBSTANCE ABUSE DISORDER.

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BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Norfolk:

Section 1:- That a \$223,000^{gr} State Opioid Response Grant from the Virginia Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services for the Norfolk Community Services Board to provide opioid treatment and peer recovery services to individuals with substance abuse disorder is accepted.

Section 2:- That \$223,000^{gr} in grant funds are hereby appropriated and authorized for expenditure, if and when made available from the Virginia Department of Behavioral Health and Development Services.

Section 3:- That this ordinance shall be in effect from and after its adoption.
