Foster Care Agreement

NACC will make you aware of any medical diagnoses associated with your foster animal, but cannot guarantee the animal will not begin to show signs of illness while in your care. As a foster parent, you will be responsible for notifying NACC at the first sign of illness, so we may assist you. All foster animal vet care must be coordinated through NACC. Foster homes are responsible for transportation to and from all appointments at NACC. _____

NACC is unable to reimburse personal expenditures for vet care, food, and other items such as toys, leashes, collars, blankets, etc. All foster animal needs should be coordinated through NACC. _____

NACC reserves the right to visit foster volunteer homes to ensure that the environment is nurturing and conducive to good health and a successful foster experience. _____

There are circumstances under which an animal may carry zoonotic conditions (transferable from animal to human). Under these circumstances, we will require that extreme care be taken to avoid the spread of the condition. Foster Volunteers must agree to follow specified guidelines of the NACC veterinarian and staff. NACC is not responsible for your family or pet's health as a result of your Foster animal. _____

Animals placed in Foster Care may need daily medication, either orally or topically. Foster Parents must be responsible for these treatments. If you feel you are unable to attend to the animal's specific needs, please let us know before you take the animal in foster care. Once in your home, you will be responsible for these treatments for the duration of their prescribed use. _____

NACC requires that all foster animals be kept separate from your resident pets unless specifically approved by the Animal Care Center staff. NACC is not to be held liable for any damage done to your home or resident pets during the foster period. _____

The most difficult issue is the possibility that the animal being fostered may need to be euthanized due to poor health prognosis or behavior problems. Foster homes must be aware of this possibility when entering a foster agreement, and respect NACC's decision should that occur. _____
