Program Overview

- **Hours of Operation:** School dismissal to 6:00 p.m. (adjusted hours on Early Release Days)
- **Participants:** K - 8th grade students
- **Fees Schedule:**
 - \$160 per month (\$80 for Power Up) for K - 5th grade participants.
 - \$80 per month (\$40 for Power Up) for 6th – 8th grade participants.
- **NPS Participation**
 - Transportation provided from 18 schools to 9 recreation/community centers
 - Dinner provided at facilities adjacent to schools
- **COVID Protocols**
 - Adhere to CDC recommendations
 - Standards implemented by the City
- **Programs**
 - Computer Programming
 - Homework assistance
 - Fitness Challenges
 - S.T.E.M activities
