
Materials

- **Small to medium sized pumpkins**
- **Small sticks**
- **Twine or rope**
- **Birdseed**



1

Cut pumpkin in half and scoop out seeds, leaving a hollow inside with 1/2 inch thick shell wall



2

Insert two sticks across the open pumpkins to create perches for the birds





Fill with birdseed



Plastic Bottle Feeder

Materials

- Plastic bottle
- Two sticks
- Scissors
- Twine
- Pin
- Funnel
- Bird seed



Make two holes at the bottom of the bottle for drainage, making them with a pin then widening with scissors

Make two small holes near the bottle neck and thread twine through to make a loop to hang it.

2

Make two holes across from each other toward the bottom for a stick that will be the perch. Do the same slightly above that one so they make an X.

3

Make two holes above the perches about 1/2 inch square so the seed doesn't fall out, for the birds to eat out of.


Fill with birdseed using the funnel, and hang!

Pine Cone Bird Feeder

Materials

- Large pine cones
- Peanut butter or honey
- Twine
- Birdseed



1

Cut a piece of twine about 10 inches long and tie it to the top of your pine cone, then tie the ends together to make a loop to hang it.

2

Spread peanut butter or drizzle honey onto the pinecone scales

3

Dip and roll pine cone into bird seed, making sure to coat it completely
