WHEREAS, the Maury Commodores football team, under the leadership of Head Coach Dyrri McCain, celebrated their victory over the Stone Bridge Bulldogs of Ashburn to win the Class 5 state championship on December 9, 2023, at the University of Virginia's Scott Stadium; and

WHEREAS, the Commodores, ranked number 83 nationally by MaxPreps, were in a state final for the third consecutive season, finishing their 2023 season with a perfect 15-0 record which included huge victories over nationally ranked Highland Springs and defending Class 4 state champion Dinwiddie; and
