



Hampton Boulevard Safety Study

Location

Hampton Boulevard from Magnolia Avenue to the Hampton Boulevard Lafayette River Bridge.

Project Benefits

This project advances Norfolk's Multimodal Transportation Master Plan, the 2015 Strategic Bicycle & Pedestrian Plan, and Vision Zero by promoting safe travel options for all modes, improving multimodal connectivity, and providing traffic calming benefits.

Scope of Work

This study takes a critical look at how to improve safety and accessibility along Hampton Boulevard between Magnolia Ave and the Hampton Blvd Lafayette River Bridge to include:

- Evaluating the need for new traffic signals
- Improving lane configurations
- Assessing speed and speed limits
- Addressing future traffic conditions

Project Status

Initial community meeting scheduled for April 29, 2024 where the City will hear from participants at the Larchmont-Edgewater civic league meeting regarding safety concerns.

Funding for design & construction - TBD


